Special guests affiliated with the Montreal General Hospital are joining the choir to administer an extra dose of enjoyment. Jazz piano accompaniment by neurologist Michael Rasminsky transports us away from the cold and *Over the Rainbow*. Family physician and flautist David Weigens joins clarinetist Julien Biret to impart a vigorous Klezmer touch to *Mayim, Mayim*. Accompaniment by a string quintet from I Medici di McGill vibrates our heartstrings as the choir performs Connie Kaldor's emotionally generous *Wood River* and Georges Moustaki's sentimental *Le temps de vivre*. "Rockin' Professor" Craig Morrison adds his guitar wizardry to *I Heard It Through the Grapevine* and other Sixties hits. And don't miss the choir's roof-raising rendition of *Ain't No Grave* for a final shot of energy.

These performers and others are joining the choir in support of the Auxiliary of The Montreal General Hospital. The Auxiliary is a volunteer group of men and women dedicated to supporting the hospital and promoting its image in the community.
